



Declarations completed and haulier generates GMR using GVMS

What are Incoterms?

- Stands for International Commercial Terms
- Internationally recognised system of establishing buyer and seller responsibility
- Relates to the delivery of goods
- Updated every 10 years
 - Latest update in 2020



Sanitary and phytosanitary (SPS) measures

- Measures to protect the biosecurity of UK
- Accounts for risk of contamination, disease and pests
- Applies to many product groups of animal or plant origin, as well as some manufactured goods





Imports to GB since leaving EU

- W High-risk animal by-products, high priority plants, and products of animal origin under safeguard measures already require pre-notifications via IPAFFS
 - IPAFFS for most food since 1 Jan 2022
- Health certificate must accompany the goods
 - Export Health Certificate (EHC) for animal origin goods
 - > Phytosanitary Certificate (PC) for plants and plant products
- Selection by a certifying officer
- Documentary, identity and physical checks at Border Control Post (BCP) or other approved location





Introduction of new controls for food imports from EU



- Pre-notification submitted in IPAFFS for food from EU
- Imports from island of Ireland excluded until further notice (except high-risk)
- Documentary, identity and physical
 checks introduced for:
 - All regulated plants and plant products
 - All meat and meat products
 - All remaining high-risk food not of animal origin
 - All goods arrive in GB via designated port location

Certificate of Conformity

Documentary, identity and physical checks introduced for all dairy products Documentary, identity and physical checks introduced for all remaining regulated products of animal origin, including composite and fish products

Certificate of Inspection Organic food

Checks on marketing standards for some fruit and vegetables



IPAFFS pre-notification – checklist

- Type of goods (i.e. product of animal origin)
 - Commodity code and type
- Commodity weight
- 🖊 Date of arrival into GB
- Reason for import (i.e. internal market, transit, research)
- Consignment's place of destination
- Addresses and contact details:
- for place of origin
- importer
- place of destination

Port of entry

Registering for IPAFFS



- You can set up IPAFFS within an existing DEFRA service account
- You can use an existing Government Gateway account or create a new one
- Decide who's the responsible person to register the business or organisation before you register to IPAFFS
- The administrator account can invite and remove other team members to the IPAFFS service account

Creates 'IMP' reference, must be included on customs declaration



Certification Animal origin goods

Export Health Certificate required for:


- Products of animal origin (POAO)
- Composite food products
- Live animals and fish
- W High-risk food not of animal origin (HRFNAO)

Exemptions

- Some composite food products
- Composite food product samples subject to authorisation
- Research and development samples
- Personal goods
- Commercial document required instead



Steps for animal origin products – from July 2022





Certification Plants or plant products



Phytosanitary certificate required for 'regulated and notifiable' and 'regulated' products:


- Plants for culinary purposes
- Seeds
- Fruit
- ♦ Vegetables

Exemptions

- Unregulated plants and plant
 products
- Processed fruit or vegetables packaged for retail
- Composite goods containing processed fruit or vegetables



Steps for plant and plant product imports – from July 2022





Approved establishments

Supplier approved to export processed POAO to GB or EU

Sollowing POAO's must come from approved establishments:

- Any meat product
- Any other processed POAO where more than 50% of finished composite food product
- Dairy products if composite food product is not shelfstable at ambient temperature
- Processing of raw POAO included in composite product
- Not required for composite food product if manufactured in a separate establishment to that of the POAO





Other food groups subject to additional measures

Organics



🔇 Fish



High-risk food not of animal origin (HRFNAO)





Common Health Entry Document (CHED)

- Electronic record of movement of live animals, animal or plant origin products
- Generated on IPAFFS
- Used by the person responsible for the load when presenting goods for inspection
- Reference included on customs declaration
- Retained by importer for 3 years





CHED versions

CHED A: Live animals

- CHED D: High-risk food not of animal origin
- ♦ CHED P: Products of animal origin
- CHED PP: Plants, plant products and propagating material





SPS inspections

Specific locations designated to carry out health checks

- Border Control Post (BCP) Animal origin goods
- Control Point (CP) Plants and plant products

Entry into GB linked to BCP/CP locations from 1 Jul 2022

- Animal and animal product imports
- Plants and plant products imports

Location is informed about your consignment in advance

IPAFFS pre-notification





Checks at BCPs

- Identity checks
- Ocumentary checks
- Physical checks





What next?

- Review current export/import operations
- Determine appropriate Incoterms
- Check suppliers are registered for health certificates, inspections and so on
- Check they are approved to export products of animal origin (where necessary)
- Identify potential exemptions for import controls
- Setablish dialogue with UK authorities and health officials
- Technical support available from IOE&IT

- Documents required
- Specific EU import conditions

Check controls and registrations

Register for IPAFFS

- Identify POAO subject to import controls (<u>Annex 1</u> <u>Regulation 2019/2007</u>)
- Composite products exempt from controls
- EU goods requiring a PC and pre-notification
- Full list of unregulated plants and plant products here
- Organic goods COI from control bodies
- ♦ GB suppliers approved to export POAO to EU
- EU suppliers approved to export POAO to GB

Restricted food imports

POAO with safeguard measures

Risk of disease outbreak or public health issue

Prohibited and restricted (P&R) goods (from 1 Jul 2022)

- Chilled minced meat (beef, pork, lamb, mutton and goat)
- Chilled or frozen minced poultry meat
- Mechanically separated meat from pigs, poultry, and ratite or game birds
- Ungraded eggs
- Chilled meat preparations
